
BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF FERRY COUNTY,

SUBJECT: Bridge Status

The biannual bridge inspections were done on half of the counties bridges on inventory in June 2008. Ferry County currently has thirty-one bridges on system. Six are shared with Stevens County and one is closed. Most of the bridges are in adequate condition, listed below are some structures with minor problems.

The Kwanis Bridge as well as the Boulder Creek Bridge needs paint. The paint will wait, as it is not a serious concern yet.

The Upper Sherman Creek Bridge has some scour problems that we are hoping to address next year.

Stevens County is currently replacing the Hedlund Bridge it is anticipated to be open by the late fall of 2008. Ferry County will be providing fill material for this project.

If there are significant changes in status after the final review of inspections, I will bring them to your attention.
