PROMOTES AND EXPANDS FORAGING OPPORTUNITES


WHEREAS, the Board finds that early settlers of Ferry County were able to use the wooded areas for multiple purposes and among those purposes were varied foraging uses; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that current and future residents of said county use and depend upon those same forested lands for varied foraging uses; and

WHEREAS, many of those forested lands are currently administered as public lands for the public good by the United States Forest Service.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commissioners of Ferry County, Washington, as the duly elected and sworn legislative authority of said County, do proclaim and affirm that foraging uses of public lands are and have always been an integral part of the culture of the residents of Ferry County and should be managed in a manner that encourages, promotes and expands foraging opportunities.
