And Expands Recreational Opportunities


WHEREAS, the Board finds that early settlers of Ferry County were able to use the wooded areas for multiple purposes and among those purposes were varied recreational uses; and


WHEREAS, the Board finds that current and future residents of said county use and depend upon those same forested lands for varied recreational uses; and

WHEREAS, many of those forested lands are currently administered as public lands for the public good by the United States Forest Service.




